Quilters, Welcome to Charity Quilting for the FGQG

I want to say hello especially to new guild members and encourage you to reach help with charity efforts of the guild. The simplest is to sew together a burp bib. Then, you can sew a pretty pocket that's given to post-surgical patients to hide the fluid drains. For kids in the hospital long term, we make pillowcases with child patterns. Lastly the guild makes child sized quilts and larger lap quilts to donate to organizations that provide services for new mothers and young families.

DURING THE MAY MONTHLY MEETING, Deborah Edwards will collect guild member suggestions for organizations that we will support with our charity items. After the suggestions are collected, Deborah Edwards will contact each proposed organization to verify their willingness to accept the charity items. At the June meeting, guild members will vote on the organizations to support during the upcoming fiscal year. Please note that making larger quilts is more challenging due to a lack of longarm quilters who are willing to donate their time, thread, etc. If you're willing to quilt some quilts for charity, it will really be appreciated.

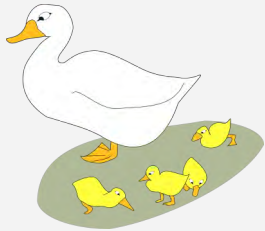

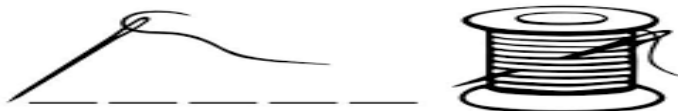

This Cookbook is a collection of Most Loved Recipes from the FGQG printed in 2001.

"CUCUMBER SALAD" by Ann Boyer

(Serves 4 to 6)

2 medium-size cucumbers

1/4 c. water

3 Tbsp. vinegar

1 tsp. sugar

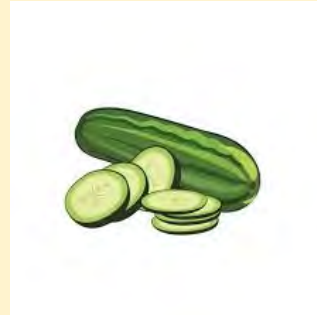
1/4 tsp. salt

1/8 tsp. pepper

2 onions (optional)

2 tomatoes (optional)

If cucumbers are waxed, pare. Otherwise, scrub and slice cucumbers, onions and tomatoes into bowl. Combine remaining ingredients; pour over cucumbers. Cover and refrigerate at least 1 hour, stirring occasionally. (Salad may be prepared in advance and stored for several days.)



"LAVADA'S MACRONI SALAD" by Ann Boyer

(Serves 6 to 8)

1 c. celery, diced

4 hard-boiled eggs, crushed 1 large onion, diced fine

1/2 green pepper, diced fine Dressing:

1/4 c. vinegar

1/4 c. sugar

1 (4 oz.) jar pimento pieces, diced fine (optional)

1/4 c. grated carrots

1 c. salad dressing

1 tsp. prepared mustard

Mix dressing and pour over other ingredients.
